

Fire Department Directory HB 1915


*“Develop a complete list of fire departments and firefighting resources within this state.”
-- that was the mandate by the Texas Legislature to Texas Forest Service during the last legislative session.*

Fire departments are the state’s primary responders. Lack of a central registry

- Results in the inability to know the overall capacity to respond and
- Hampers state agencies and associations in identifying and responding to statewide and regional needs

To help achieve the intent of HB1915, Texas Forest Service, in cooperation with the fire associations and agencies of Texas, developed an online **Fire Department Directory** (FDD) application.

- **Web-based system to capture essential information**

- **Available to all fire departments, agencies and associations**
- **Joint effort with numerous agencies:**

 - Office of Rural Community Affairs
 - Texas Commission on Fire Protection
 - Texas Engineering Extension Service
 - Texas State Fire Marshal’s Office of the Texas Department of Insurance
 - State Firemen’s and Fire Marshals’ Association of Texas
 - Texas Fire Chiefs Association
 - Texas Fire Marshals Association
 - Texas State Association of Fire and Emergency Districts
 - Texas State Association of Fire Fighters

- 1) Obtain user name and password
- 2) Access and edit department and equipment information
- 3) Check status and history of any assistance requests (grants, FEPP, Helping Hands, etc.) and fire reports submitted to Texas Forest Service
