Topics include: purpose of the rapid intervention team; OSHA 2 In/2 Out Rule; training requirements; duties of the RIT officer; maintaining a proactive stance; information gathering; equipment used; deploying the team; search techniques; and rescue techniques.

The objectives are: to define what a Rapid Intervention Team is, to show how they function outside and inside the hazard zone, to describe how to locate firefighters in distress, to show how to perform an initial assessment of a downed firefighter, to describe air-supply considerations for trapped firefighters, and to show a variety of rescue techniques. The training packet consists of a lesson plan, 2 DVDs, a CDROM with a power point presentation, and transparency masters.

Ricci and Chief Norwood discuss potential tactical failures on the fireground and the significance of Mayday training on all levels of the fire department -- from probie up to the chief -- in order to properly mitigate a Mayday situation.
