


Apply for Certification


Apply for Certification

•You must pass each section of the examination with a minimum score of 70%. You must apply for certification by submitting the application for certification online through your Individual FIDO account. You must also document Medical Training and have your criminal history background done. (FAST Pass Fingerprint/criminal history background check for TCFP) and pay the \$85.00 fee.

Note: Upon passing all sections of the examination and proof of medical training (uploaded into FIDO) and FAST Pass Fingerprint/criminal history background check, an individual must apply for Certification within 2 years of original test date.

Certification Upgrade


From Basic to Intermediate Structure Fire Suppression you must:

- Hold Basic Structure Fire Suppression certification
- Have four (4) years of experience in fire protection
- Document completion of required professional development

You must document training completed from the commission approved A-list and B-list of courses or college credits in fire science and upload them to your FIDO Account to be eligible for upgrade.

*Note: Training used for this certification level must be in addition to any training used previously. You cannot repeat a course or use a course of similar content towards this level, ex. you cannot use components of basic SFF (FFI, FFII, AWS, OPS) to upgrade SFF certification.







Apply for IFSAC Seals:

- •IFSAC seals are not required by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection for certification.
- •To qualify for the applicable IFSAC seal you must pass your exams with a minimum score of 70%.

You must also have your proof of medical training uploaded to your FIDO Account.

Note: Upon passing all sections of the examination and uploading you medical training, an individual must apply for IFSAC Seals within 2 years of original test date.
