Education and Experience - An equivalent combination of education, training and experience will be considered.

Education Experience Certifications High School diploma or GED. No previous experience is required.

- Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP) Basic Firefighter certification (or higher).
 - o If hired, an EMT-P (only) must be able to successfully complete the fire training program and obtain the TCFP basic structural firefighter certification within twelve months of hire date.
- Texas Department of State Health Services Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Basic certification, Paramedic preferred.
 - If hired, an EMT-B with TCFP Basic Structural Firefighter certification must attend a recognized Paramedic class with completion date and State/National Certification within 24 months of hire date.

This job description in no way states or implies that these are the only duties to be performed by the employee occupying this position. Summary

This position is responsible for administering appropriate emergency medical treatment to victims of accidents and other life-threatening situations, including transport of patients, assisting with firefighting tasks to prevent and mitigate fires, maintaining emergency medical equipment and vehicles, and assisting with emergency medical training. If offered the position as a paramedic (only), applicant must be able to successfully complete the fire training program and obtain the TCFP basic structural firefighter certification within twelve months of hire date.

Essential Job Functions

- EMS services. Respond to 911 emergency calls 24 hours a day, providing life saving/medical skills, maintanance, restocking the ambulance, cleaning/disinfecting the ambulance and equipment, and training.
- Fire services. Responding to fires and other emergencies/non-emergencies 24 hours a day, providing fire suppression, scene safety, scene clean-up on fires and MVA scenes, cleaning and maintaining equipment, lift assists, EMS backup, fire engineer operator,
- Medical transfers. Taking patients from local hospital to out of town higher level hospital, to a nursing home facility, or back to a residence. Also picking non-emergency patients from nursing homes, residence's needing to be transferred to local hospitals.
- Public relations. Speaking to the public, teaching/informing the public of fire or medical topics, welfare checks, checking blood pressures at commercial businesses, and carseat checks.
- Daily and monthly checks on all equipment, continuous training to maintain license and safety, public relations, public education, cleaning and maintaining station, maintaining lawn of station, etc.
- Ensure adequate inventory supply aboard emergency medical vehicles.
- Extricate victims in accidents.
- Prepare and complete required reports.
- Regular and timely attendance is required.

Ancillary Job Functions

• Contributes to team effort by performing other related duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities which may be representative, but not all-inclusive of those commonly associated with this position.

- Working closely with others as a member of the team, while working in a very noisy distracting environment. Performing multiple tasks may be necessary as well as working on very tedious and physically exhausting projects.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with personnel.
- Those medical skills learned in paramedic school.
- Those skills learned and mastered in the fire academy.
- Knowledge of the geography of City of Jacksonville and the road system.
- Skill in driving emergency vehicles.

Equipment and Tools commonly associated with the performance of the functions of this job.

Fire engine, Ladder truck, ambulance, rescue tools, life saving drugs, cardiac monitor, cardiac defibrillator.confidential documentation. Microsoft Word/Office

Work Environment or atmospheric conditions commonly associated with the performance of the functions of this job.
