



Job Posting: Deputy Fire Marshal for Travis County Fire Rescue, ESD 11

About us:

Travis County Emergency Service District 11, publicly known as Travis County Fire Rescue (TCFR), has a service area of approximately 240 square miles and includes a portion of southeast Travis County, northern Caldwell County, and northeastern Hays County. The fire district includes Del Valle, Mustang Ridge, Garfield, Neiderwald, Creedmoor, and Uhland. TCFR has 9 staffed fire stations with one currently being constructed.

Job Summary: The Deputy Fire Marshal operates within the Fire Prevention Division of Travis County Fire Rescue (Travis County Emergency Service District 11), Fire Department and will report to the Assistant Fire Marshal or Fire Marshal.

Key Responsibilities

- Perform fire inspections, plan reviews, and follow-up inspections to ensure compliance.
- Attend meetings regarding development within TCFR jurisdiction.
- Analyze fire and explosion scenes to determine origin and cause; document and photograph scenes, gather evidence, and conduct interviews.
- Complete investigations and case reports
- Support emergency operations in fire protection, rescue, law enforcement, hazmat, and emergency management.
- Conduct fire safety classes and public presentations on community risk reduction.
- Maintain Fire Department vehicles/equipment.

Minimum Requirements

- Five (5) years of experience in public safety
- Basic TCOLE Peace Officer certification
- Basic TCFP Arson Investigator
- Basic TCFP Fire Inspector
- Valid Texas Driver's License.
